We have had another busy week in kindergarten!

In literature we began a unit on “Putting it Together,” or building things. Our main story of the week was “Building With Dad”, which was the story of a young boy who visited the construction site on which his dad was building a new school. We also drew pictures of our school, like the architect, and built schools out of blocks. We reviewed the vowels “a” and “l” and learned two new color words orange and purple.

In math we completed our unit on analyzing, comparing, and composing shapes. One fun project we did was to construct cubical houses with a partner by using toothpicks and marshmallows. We pretended it was one of the three pigs’ homes, and then took turns trying to “huff and puff and blow the house down” like the big, bad wolf. No one was able to blow down any of the houses, so we concluded that all the homes were as strong as the brick house.

In science we worked on an engineering project of constructing a bridge over a lake, which would enable gnomes to get their vegetable crop to market in a neighboring town in a more timely way. In religion we continued to talk about being good stewards of God’s creation. We also discussed the May virtue of the month, which is “unity.” We talked about how God wants us to include others in our activities and games. We began a Second Step series of lessons on bullying.
